Registration Fee

CEU Credits will be provided to ABMDI certificants.

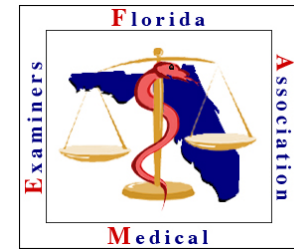
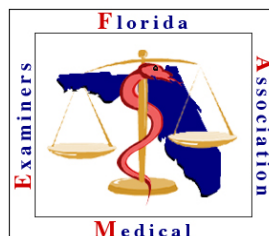
