

Location

The conference will be held at the Four Seasons Resort Orlando at Walt Disney Resort at 10100 Dream Tree Boulevard, Lake Buena Vista, FL 32836. The group room rate is \$199. No resort fee. Parking fees \$26 per vehicle plus tax, per night.

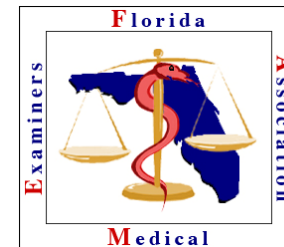
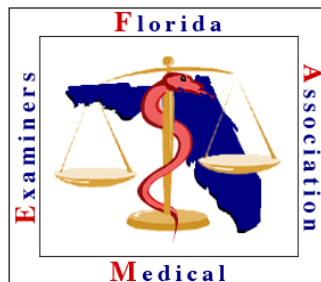
